First of all because there is one significant difference you may notice. You will no longer have access to the classic OPAC (online patron access catalog) and will have to use the newer LS2 version. The second reason we want to make you aware is because we may need some extra grace as we navigate the changes to our processes and how we serve you. We are hoping for a smooth, seamless transition, but that doesn't always happen with technology. Also, since many of the changes directly affect the technical services department and how they process new materials, there may be some slight delays in getting these items out on the shelves.

As always, our main priority at JCPL is to "inform, enrich, and empower our diverse community," and this transition will allow us to continue providing the best service possible!
