



ADVENTURE BEGINS AT JCPL!

Summer will be here soon – that means longer days, warmer temps, vacations... and JCPL's Summer Reading Program! This year's theme is "Adventure Begins at Your Library."

As in past years, our youngest patrons will be able to complete a Bingo sheet with various literacy initiatives. Children K-5 will be able to log their reading to receive weekly prizes and a chance to win a grand prize, as well as will be invited to attend weekly performers in June. This year's performers will include Magician Marc Lehmann, Indiana Wild, and the Science Tellers. Various other events will occur throughout July, such as a Firefly Awards Story Time, and each branch will be offering additional incentives for kids who continue to log their reading activities.

Teens will also be able to participate in weekly events at each of the branches and can log their reading to be entered into weekly and grand prize drawings through the month of June. Adults, too, will have their own weekly drawings between June 3 and July 27 for \$15 gift certificates at each location, as well as \$50 grand prize drawings at the end of July.

JCPL will be using Beanstack to log all reading. If you have participated in winter or summer reading events over the past two years, then you are probably familiar with the app. When you first begin logging again this year, you may need to

update the age/grade of any children, but everything else should be similar to past experiences. For anyone using Beanstack for the first time, we suggest you follow the QR code on the next page to learn more.

JCPL knows the importance of continued reading throughout the summer – reading just 4 books a summer can keep kids at their current reading level. Studies suggest that children who don't read over the summer can lose up to 3 months of reading comprehension; this loss is cumulative, resulting in 2 years of reading comprehension loss by the end of 6th grade. Therefore, we encourage kids to keep reading this summer and start their adventure at the library, where we inform, enrich, and empower our diverse community every day.


